Greater Scranton features a variety of galleries and museums for historians and art enthusiasts to enjoy. Visitors to the area can climb on powerful steam locomotives, see one of the world's most impressive collections of Dorflinger glass, and inspect a Czech Torah that survived the Holocaust. They can also travel 300 feet below the earth's surface in a real coal mine, see a full-scale stegosaurus skeleton, peer into 150-year old massive blast furnaces and visit an actual basilica.
